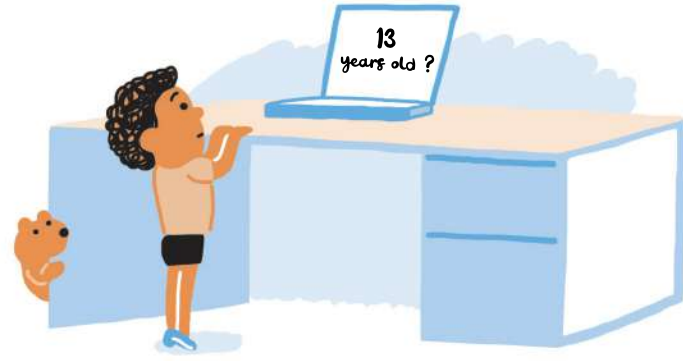


6 Social Media Best Practices to Follow

Don't Post Before You're 13

Verify your friends' identity, and don't forget that anyone could be hiding behind a false username or avatar. Protect your sign-in information so no one tries to steal your identity.

Ask for Help

Whether you are a victim of or a witness to cyber-bullying, remember that it's a crime. Talk about your experience with a trusted adult.
