What's a Passphrase?

A passphrase is a full sentence turned into a password.
Its longer (which makes it safer) and much easier to remember!

Hey, Cyber-Heroes!

Do you think "123456" or your cat's name makes a good password? Bad news—that wouldn't stand a chance against a hacker!

Here's a foolproof way to create super-secure passwords: the passphrase method.

3 Steps to a Ninja-Level Passphrase:



2 Turn it into a secret code

Keep the key words but mix things up—add numbers, symbols, or swap letters for special characters:

 "ILovePizza@3AM!"

 "WInterIsCOming?"

 "BigF@n21Piece"

1 Choose a sentence you love:

It could be a movie quote, song lyrics, or even a random phrase you make up:

 "I love eating pizza at 3 AM"

 "Winter is coming" for TV fans

 "Big fan of One Piece" for manga lovers

3 Personalize it even more:

Add a lucky number or something related to your interests:

 "SoccerILovePizza@3AM!"

 "WInterIsCOming?42"

 "BigF@n21Piece2024"

What NOT to do



Use your pet's name
(Sorry, Rex!)



Set your password as
"password," "123456,"
or "qwerty"



Use your birthdate
(even your crush's wont work!)
